

# **2021-2022 ANNUAL REPORT**

We are committed to ALL Colorado students acquiring the knowledge and skills necessary to make informed decisions in their personal, professional and civic lives.

## STATE INITIATIVE

Economic Literacy Colorado educated 284 teachers in the fourth year of MoneyWi\$er Personal Finance for Teachers, a multi-year initiative designed to enrich teachers personally and professionally. This brings the total number of MoneyWi\$er teachers to 1,667. The workshops and programs were developed by EconLitCo and presented in collaboration with the Colorado AG's Office, Colorado Department of Education, and Colorado Jump\$tart Coalition.

Fiscal year 2021-2022, while still overshadowed by the COVID pandemic and related teacher fatique, began a return to in-person events and programs. Our programs were a mixture of online and hybrid and our events were all in person. We hired a new student programs director, which allowed us to launch the Invest in Girls program, and we are exploring more student-focused programs going forward.




